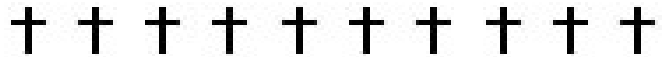

YOUR COLLECTION IS AN ACT OF JUSTICE

If it is true that where your treasure lies, there also will your heart be, then how we disburse money from the weekly collection can be seen as an act of justice. Churches depend greatly on the weekly collection to cover internal costs. Churches need to pay just wages to its employees, take care of bills, purchase equipment and supplies and invest in programs that help parishioners grow in their faith.

Many churches also depend upon collections to help them directly serve those in need. Daily, people come to its doors looking for food, clothing, housing, or some other assistance and parishes have many programs designed specifically for works of service.
