Practice Makes Catholic - Did you know?

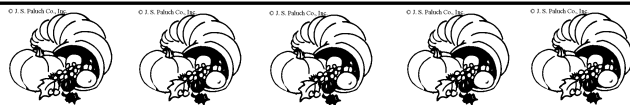
We are called to stand up for our faith.

Edith Stein was born into an observant German Jewish family on October 12th 1891. During most of her teenage years she professed to be an atheist. Following the carnage of World War I she became a nursing assistant. During her studies she also read The Works of Teresa of Avila which prompted her to convert to Catholicism.

She was baptized on January 1, 1922. She worked as a teaching assistant after finishing her doctoral thesis in 1916 until her Jewish heritage forced her to resign under the Nazis. Edith & her sister Rosa, also a convert, entered the Carmelites & were moved to the Netherlands where they worked quietly until they were arrested & sent to Auschwitz. They both died in the gas chamber on August 9, 1942.
