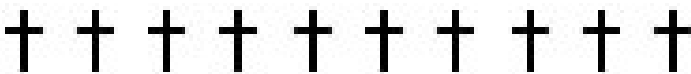

To serve on the Parish Council you must be at least 18 years of age; a fully initiated (Received the Sacraments of Initiation) registered member of the parish; and a Catholic in good standing. The new members will be chosen using a selection process rather than an election process.

Practice Makes Catholic - Did you know?

There are several times when we have an obvious anointing with oil. At our Baptism, Confirmation & Anointing of the sick.

Did you ever wonder why we asked for our heads to be Anointed with oil? Jesus, in his teachings, frequently refers to Shepherds & their sheep. It's something that the people of his time would have understood. Sheep frequently get their heads caught in briars, they hurt themselves trying to get free. They have flies laying eggs, which cause them torment & they beat their heads against the rocks in order to dislodge them. Flies & other insects torment their eyes & ears. The shepherd pours oil over their heads causing the torments to be to dislodge & giving them peace.

When we are anointed with oil we are cloaked with God's protective balm. The torments of our mind & soul is eased. He brings us His peace. He prepares us to go forth with firm resolve knowing that we are under His protection & will be protected from our torment. This being the case, maybe we should ask him to not only anoint our heads with oil but all of our body. Let His cup overflow & make our bodies so slippery that the devil cannot take hold.
